TEN COMMANDMENTS

- Make two tablets out of air-drying clay. Use clay tools, or improvised tools (such as knitting needles) to carve out the words.

TORAH SCROLLS

Using a piece of A4 card, fold it in a gate fold to make an "ark" - a gate-fold card involves having the opening at the centre and two edges on either side. This can be accomplished with any size paper by finding the centre of a strip of paper and folding the ends in to meet at the centre. Make a pocket on the inside on the back of the card, by sticking a square of card on three sides, leaving the top open. Make a little Torah scroll by gluing a piece of felt onto a Torah shaped piece of card. Children can decorate the felt Torah with stick-on "jewels" or fabric pens.

PUPPETS

 Make sock puppets to use to tell the story of either Ruth, or how the Jews were chosen to receive the Torah. Use old, clean socks, add stick-on googly eyes, felt mouths and wool for hair. Stick with PVA glue and allow to dry before using.
