

## MATCHING CARDS

<b>DEVELOPMENTAL DELAY</b>	A child may grow and develop more slowly than other children. His or her physical, mental or emotional development may be affected.
<b>EMOTIONAL/BEHAVIORAL NEEDS</b>	This child may have unpredictable reactions to situations, and may require additional help learning to follow daily routines or relating to others.
<b>EXCEPTIONAL HEALTH NEEDS</b>	This relates to conditions such as allergies, asthma, diabetes, epilepsy, sickle cell anemia, or because of a serious illness.
<b>HEARING IMPAIRMENT</b>	A child may have glue ear, hear less well than others or have partial or profound deafness

<b>COMMUNICATION DISORDER</b>	A child may have difficulty speaking or understanding speech. Expressing his or her needs or understanding rules and instructions may be difficult and frustrating for the child with this type of need.
<b>LEARNING DISABILITY</b>	A child may have difficult grasping concepts, consequences or specific difficulties as they start to learning to read
<b>PHYSICAL DISABILITY</b>	A child may have limited movement or require adaptive equipment to support their mobility
<b>VISION IMPAIRMENT</b>	A child may have partial sight, reduced sight or be blind
