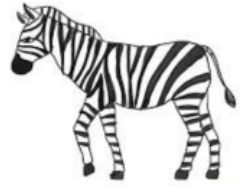




Focus Activity | Session Plan | Zebras



Theme	Evening routines at home
Learning Intention	To be able to recount what happens in the evening
Introduction	Tell the children a 'story' about what YOU do when you get home from gan, til bed time. Ask children what they do. Use the routine cards, and put them in order on the board, describing the sequence
Activity	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Pyjama matching game2. Bathing the baby dolls, putting the PJs on and putting them to bed3. Putting the bedtime sequences cards in order on the white board
Conclusion	Put the Day and Night posters on the floor, then read out each of the 'day/night' cards, and ask the children if this happens in the day or the night! Then, place the cards on the correct poster. Review. Then, sing the bedtime song, and dance!
Resources to Prepare/use	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. PJ matching game, laminated2. All the baby dolls from the building3. Bath and beds for baby dolls4. Bedtime sequencing cards with magnets (stick magnets to the back)5. Day and Night posters printed, and question/picture cards
Differentiation notes	More able children can describe their own bedtime routine at home. Ask specific questions about the order that things happen at home. "Do you bath before or after your dinner?" Extension: Children can 'interview' each other about their evening routines. "What do you do after gan?" etc.
